



THE PROJECT

The Farm Walk Trail Network is a collaborative initiative of food, farming, and agritourism organizations brought together to create a directory of walking trails on farms across the state. Hosted on DigInVT.com, the Vermont Farm Walk Trail concept is built on the idea that farms are places for both production and recreation. The onset of COVID-19 catalyzed the project, as people sought safe places to be outdoors. The farm trail network proved so popular that winter farm trails (featuring cross country skiing and snow shoeing) were added to DigInVT, thanks to a University of Vermont grant.

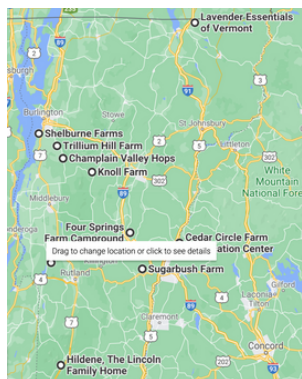

- LEAVE MACHINERY AND FARM ANIMALS ALONE.
- LEAVE GATES AND PROPERTY AS YOU FIND THEM.
- IF DOGS ARE PERMITTED, BE SURE TO CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG.
